

# What is the Clergy Education & Training Fund?

Those seeking to undertake the work of the Church in the Diocese have many training needs. Candidates accepted for priestly formation spend around 6 years at a Seminary. Whilst the time in Seminary helps the student to determine God's will for him, it is also designed to provide experiences so that the student can play a full role in parish community life following Ordination. Training is also undertaken by those men wishing to become Permanent Deacons in Parishes in the Diocese.

As in most occupations, learning and education is a life-long process, and Priests and Deacons have ongoing training needs in their ministries. However, training for Seminarians, Deacons and Clergy involves considerable expense, and the Clergy Education & Training Fund seeks to help meet these costs.

## Why does the Clergy Education & Training Fund need your help?

At a time of shortages of Priests, it is a blessing that we have men studying for the Priesthood and Diaconate. This is good news for the people of the Diocese, but the training is expensive - for example, it costs around £30,000 a year (about £80 a day) to train a Seminarian, and £4,000 a year to train a Deacon. The Clergy Education & Training Fund helps meet these costs, the ongoing training needs of Clergy, and in certain instances the cost of training Laity (such as Eucharistic Ministers).

# How can you help?

Your support of the Clergy Education & Training Fund is essential if we are to continue to support the cost of training Seminarians and Deacons, and to meet the ongoing training of Clergy required to meet the various needs of Parishes and the Diocese. We need everyone to give generously in order that we can meet these costs.

**Pause for Hope** : is a prayer Initiative for dealing with cancer. Service taking place at St Columba's Church, Plas Newton Lane Chester on Sunday 14th November at 3pm.

Dicastery for promoting Integral Human Development— Cardinal Turkson has written announcing the establishment of a Laudato Si Action Platform to be launched on the Global Day of Prayer for the Poor, 14th November 2021. The platform will propose a 7-year journey based on the 7 goals to which Pope Francis has recalled us on the anniversary year of Laudato Si.

From the Holy See on Synod 2021/2023: The Secretariat for Synods of Bishops has announced an extension of the diocesan listening stage of the preparation for the 2023 International Synod of Bishops. The extension will be until the Summer of 2022. This change of timescale will allow for an additional two months in our own diocesan listening phase. This time of listening that is primarily a spiritual process will surely benefit from this additional allocation of time. The AMENDED DIOCESAN TIME-TABLE FOR THE LISTEN-ING PHASE is as follows: 1 1st March 2022 – All written reflections to be received by the Bishop's Office (changed from 17th December 2021) 🗆 3rd April 2022 – I will offer the diocesan discernment (changed from 16th January 2022) 🗆 8th April 2022 – All diocesan discernments to be received by the secretariat of the Bishops Conference of England and Wales in readiness for the plenary assembly of the bishops in Cardiff 2nd – 6th May.

Faith leaders, Cardinal Vincent Nichols, Archbishop Justin Welby, and the Chief Rabbi, Ephraim Mirvis, warn of risks of Assisted Dying bill to vulnerable — 'we wish to express our profound disquiet at the provisions of the 'Assisted Dying' Bill currently in the House of Lords. We acknowledge that Baroness Meacher is seeking the alleviation of suffering. This motivation we share wholeheartedly, but we disagree on the means advanced to address this very real concern. In particular, we are conscious of the risks and dangers entailed in the provisions of the Bill and the 'real-life' practical inadequacies of the proposed safeguards. By the faiths we profess, we hold every human life to be a precious gift of the Creator, to be upheld and protected. All people of faith, and those of none, can share our concern that the common good is not served by policies or actions that would place very many vulnerable people in more vulnerable positions. We appeal to people of whatever faith or belief to join us through our common bond of humanity in caring for the most vulnerable people within our society. In contrast to the proposals in this Bill, we continue to call for measures to make high-quality palliative care available to all at the end of their lives. We believe that the aim of a compassionate society should be assisted living rather than an acceptance of assisted suicide.
