Message from Bishop Mark Davies on Assisted Suicide. 'We are all aware of the latest attempts to breach the moral boundaries and legal safeguards to allow the killing of the sick and elderly in medically assisted suicide. Thank you for all you have done in the parishes during these past few weeks. I think you will also be aware now that the vote initially to take place on Friday of Easter Week, has been postponed by the Bill's sponsors until Friday 16th May. An optimistic and hopefully realistic reading of the reasons for this delay is loss of support among Members of Parliament. The well-funded and organised campaign for euthanasia will undoubtably use the intervening weeks to seek to persuade wavering MPs to re-commit to what is now widely acknowledged to be a "dangerously flawed" Bill. We must continue to encourage our Members of Parliament to vote against the Bill by contacting them directly and if possible arranging meetings where a clear and reasoned case can be made. Let us also pray and intercede in this time of the Christian Year that celebrates the victory over sin and death that the value of human life will be upheld in our society. If this Bill is vanquished on 16th May (which requires from the previous vote only a small number of MP's to change their mind) it will be a significant rejection of the "culture of death" both in our country and the wider world and we hope prompt fuller consideration of the need to improve palliative care.'

The attendance this year, right from Palm Sunday, has almost doubled. The reception of eight very committed new members into the Church crowns it all.
